Music is springing up all over MHS in preparation for the many activities this month. You walk through the halls and hear marimbas, flutes & voices. You see students studying music, listening to iPods (no doubt they are listening to the sound files of their solos...hmmm) and students are hanging out in the choir room during lunch to practice. These are all great things to see and hear!

For our Spring Chorale Collage Concert, we will feature some of these solo and ensemble events from all the choirs. You will hear everything from barbershop quartets to German Lieder and Italian arias. Of the 56 vocal events we have participating at the District festival it will be difficult to limit the number of performances at the concert. Some of the events will also perform at the Youth Art Month reception held at the E.D. Locke Public Library on Thursday, March 5 from 6:10 – 6:35.

In addition to the solo and ensembles, the choirs will each perform four or five choral pieces. The Concert Choir has been working on "Die Nachtigall" or "The Nightingale" by Felix Mendelssohn. Preparation has included background information on the Romantic Era, biographies of the poet and composer, and a translation of the German text. The choir will perform the piece in German. The gentlemen will perform "The Soldier's Chorus" from the opera *Faust* by Charles Gounod and the ladies will perform "Chorus of the Polovetsian Maidens" from *Prince Igor* by Alexander Borodin. Both of these selections are also from the Romantic Era. Their final piece is "Praise His Holy Name", an energetic spiritual by Keith Hampton.

A Cappella Choir will feature two songs that were performed at the Rock Valley Honors Choir concert February 3. "All That Hath Life & Breath Praise Ye the Lord!" by Rene Clausen is a wonderful introduction to the contemporary style that features an aleatoric section. This means that part of the composition or performance is left to chance. In this case, the sopranos are given three short melodies that they individually choose when to sing and at what tempo during a 35 second time span. The second piece from the Rock Valley Honors Choir is a beautiful a cappella ballade entitled "Sing Me to Heaven". The lush harmonics and expressive phrasing will capture your attention.

A Cappella choir has also taken on the challenge of learning a piece in Hebrew for this concert. "Five

Hebrew Love Songs" by Eric Whitacre has become one of our favorite pieces. We are performing two of the five, *Temuná* (meaning A picture) and *Kalá kallá*, (meaning Light bride). These two poems capture special moments between the young American composer and his wife who was born and raised in Jerusalem. The songs feature piano, violin and tambourine.

Like the Concert Choir, the men and women will each perform a song. The men will perform a contemporary gospel arrangement of "Amazing Grace" and the women will perform a traditional spiritual by William Dawson, "Ain-a That Good News!"

Finally, we will end our concert with the community joining us in singing the "Hallelujah Chorus" from *Messiah* by George Frederick Handel. We welcome all singers to join us for a brief rehearsal at 6:45 in the auditorium. This has become a time-honored tradition at McFarland, this being the first year we are singing it at the spring concert rather than in December. Within the storyline of Messiah it is placed during the resurrection, so this will fit well with our spring concert and within our year-long focus of music that tells a story.

We look forward to sharing our music with you on Monday, March 9<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 PM. Students are asked to report to the stage at the following times:

#### Solo/Ensemble Festival

### Saturday, March 14<sup>th</sup>, 2009 McFarland HS

All students are welcome to participate in a solo, duet, trio or other ensemble provided that they are <u>dedicated to practicing on a regular basis outside of class</u>. Solo/Ensemble is not a requirement of choir, but it is a wonderful opportunity to work on your individual skills and performance abilities as a vocalist. All events are performed in front of a judge who then critiques you on your technique, interpretation, tone, rhythmic and note accuracy and style.

As part of the preparation process, students were given the opportunity to have sound files of their parts, the accompaniment, and the pronunciation of foreign language emailed to them. They were also strongly encouraged to check YouTube and iTunes for recordings of their solo. All students are expected to practice with a teacher once a week during lunch and choir class as well as outside of class.

As we near the festival date, it is important to have the following details completed so you may have the best performance possible:

#### Responsibilities with Accompanist:

- Set up 2 or 3 rehearsal times with your accompanist
- Notify accompanist of your performance time (available the week prior to festival)

#### Responsibilities with MUSIC:

- Memorize your solo (highly recommended)
- Obtain judges copy (NO PHOTOCOPIES ALLOWED! You will be disqualified if you or your judge has a photocopy!)
- Measures are numbered
- Introduction and interesting aspect completed

  Others

#### Other:

- Pay your accompanist fee(s) to your director(s). Checks payable to MHS. Each event is \$17.50, with ensembles prorated based on the number of students involved.
- Write a short thank you note to your accompanist
- Verify that the original judges copies are in the box Mrs. Nichols will take to solo/ensemble.

#### Performance Day Tips:

- Dress nicely you want to make a good first impression! (Please no short skirts or low cut shirts ladies! No jeans or t-shirts and wear or bring comfortable shoes.)
- Arrive early so you know where your events are, you have a chance to warm-up & are able to visit your performance site to listen to comments the judge has about other performances.
- Bring a bottle of water
- Eat a nutritious breakfast
- Get a good night sleep the night before

Remember: This experience is about YOU becoming a better performer, not a rating, not a medal. If you have worked to become better at your craft, then you have succeeded.
